- One-on-One support from a Family Support Worker

- Ongoing educational workshops and engagement activities for all family members
- Individualized goal setting for economic advancement
- Guidance for all ages to achieve higher education
- Material and financial assistance, resource linkage provided based on families' needs

Direct Services Provided In-Home

Family Support Workers are available to visit with families in the comfort of their home on a regular basis, tailored to support individual needs. Additionally, individual and family professional counseling can be delivered directly in the home.

Monthly Events

Supportive and educational events provided year round to give opportunities for families to learn and grow together.

Economic Advancement

Active collaboration with education based community partners to provide opportunities for all family members currently enrolled in school to thrive. Assistance in enrolling for higher or continuing education. Goal setting support to improve employment opportunities.

Financial Empowerment

Interactive skill building sessions provided for adults and youth to create a foundation of resilience. Fun and informative activities to teach youth about money management, saving, and grant independence.
